Guidance Counselor



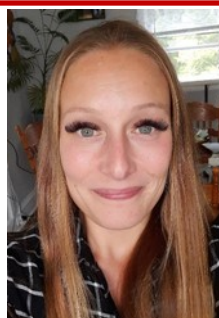

Special Education Paraprofessional

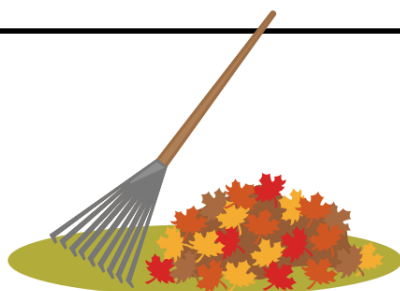

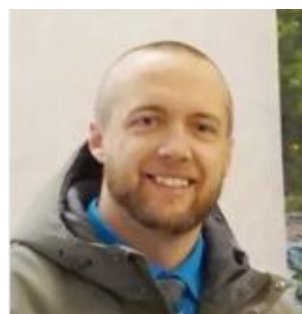

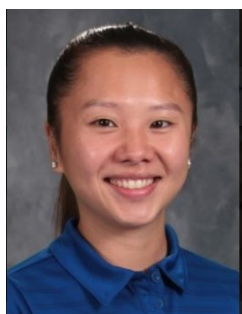
**DAWN WALBECK**

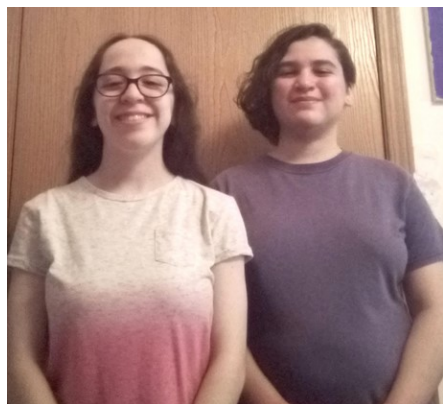


**BECKY ZOROMSKI**

## Registration for the May 2022 IB Exams

Should your junior or senior student register for the IB exams?

Who is eligible to register?

How and when do they register?

What is the cost?

To clarify these questions and others, information is posted on the Wausau East IB webpage. From the East homepage select 'School Info' then 'International Baccalaureate World School'. The IB Exam Registration information is under the heading, 'IB at Wausau East'.

You can also stop by the IB Resource Center, next to the JackShack, during parent conferences on October 14 and 27 to pick up handouts that will explain the IB Exam Registration process. If you would like to discuss the registration process, please sign up for a parent conference with the IB Coordinator, Darlene Beattie.

Registration for the May 2022 IB exams will take place from **Monday, September 27 through Wednesday, October 27**. Be sure to mark your calendars because this is the only time for IB exam registration. Eligible students will complete a registration form through google forms that will be emailed to them. Payments can be made with a credit or debit card through the Infinite Campus Parent Portal or by a check made out to Wausau East High School. **Registration fees are not refundable.**

Examinations will be administered in accordance with IB regulations. The IB Exam schedule for the May 2022 session can also be found on our website. The exam dates are not negotiable. As a result, exams take priority over other school activities.

### Scholarships - Free Money for College!

Log onto Wausau East High School at: <http://east.wausauschools.org/> Click on Student Services, choose Career Planning, and click on Scholarships.

Tips for successful scholarship searching/applying:

- Use a personal email just for scholarships.
- Keep track of what you are interested in applying for.
- Missed a due date? Keep track of the scholarship so you can apply for it next year with the new deadline.
- Be willing to put the time and effort in each day. Remember it is money you don't have to pay back.
- Ask for help! Your school counselor, Career Center Coordinator, teachers, etc. are all here to help.



## College Bound?

College admission test are one of the requirements when applying to a college or university. Both the ACT (American College Test) and the SAT (Scholastic Aptitude Test) are admission tests. A student may choose to take one of both of these assessments. However, it should be noted that the University of Wisconsin has historically preferred scores from the ACT assessment as part of its entrance requirements. Also, to qualify for some scholarships a student may be required to submit an ACT or SAT score.

Students may register for either test online at the following address: [ACT](#) or [SAT](#)

NOTE: The ACT has an optional writing test. It is important for students to check online at [ACT](#) prior to registering to take the test, to see if the college(s) they plan on applying to requires the writing test. Not all schools require the test. The SAT also has a writing section to its test; however, it is included as part of the test and all students who take the SAT will take the writing component. Both testing companies indicate that applying online expedites registration.

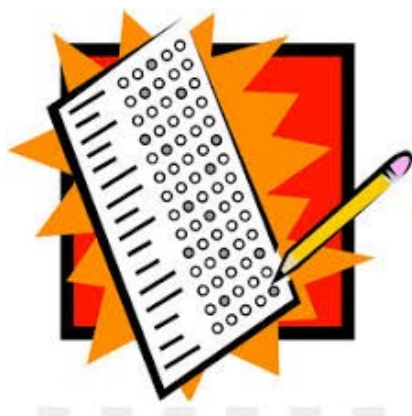

## Career Center News

The Career Center (Room E146) is a place where students are able to receive support and access to a variety of resources to help investigate, research and develop a career plan and explore their post-secondary options.

**College and Military Visits:** Representatives from colleges, universities and the military will visit the Career Center throughout the year. Students should watch for advertisements and emails and make a point to stop by the Career Center to meet with a rep and learn more about their post-secondary options.

**ASVAB:** The ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery) will be offered at Wausau West to any interested junior or senior. The ASVAB is a voluntary, free career aptitude test designed for students who plan to enter the military upon graduation OR for students who simply want to learn how their skills and interests match hundreds of occupations. The ASVAB is a three hour test. If you have questions, see Mrs. Gauger in the Career Center.

**Selective Service:** All males must register with Selective Service within 30 days of their 18th birthday. Students may register as early as three months after their 17th birthday. This is not a school requirement, it is the law. Failure to register will affect a student's ability to receive financial aid, job training or to gain citizenship. Registering with Selective Service is easy and only takes about two minutes. Go online at [www.sss.gov](http://www.sss.gov)
